I. What Values Are We To Pass On To Our Children?

- A. **Value #1 + “Value God as the source of all things.”**
- B. **Value #2 - “Value the Bible as the truth of God.”**
 1. We are people who believe that “All Scripture is God-breathed.”
- C. **Value #3 + “Value the family as the basic unit of God.”**
 1. The Bible tells us, “**A man will leave his father and his mother and be united to his wife, and they become one flesh.**”
- D. **Value #4 + “Value the church as the called of God.”**
 1. Jesus said, “**The kingdom of Heaven is like a treasure hidden in a field.**”

II. How Do We Impart These Values To Our Children?

- A. First, “**Be totally committed to Christ yourself.**”
- B. Second, “**Build a loving relationship with your children.**”
 1. Paul would say, “**Do not exasperate your children.**” How do you do that?
 2. I want to give you 4 costly mistakes.
 3. **Overprotection, Overindulgence, Over-permissiveness, and Over-discipline.**
- C. Third, “**Saturate their lives with the Word of God.**”
- D. Fourth, “**Protect them from the world’s propaganda.**”
- E. Fifth, “**Pray for them daily.**”
