1. Worship is the core purpose of mankind.
    - a. **“You shall have no other gods before me.” (Exodus 20:3)**
  2. America is a worshipping nation, although not necessarily a Christian nation anymore.
  3. Turn with me to **Isaiah 6:1-8**.
    - a. Before we begin, a little background would be helpful.
- I. A Vision of God Reveals His Glory. Isaiah 6:1-3 “I saw the Lord seated on a throne, ...”**
- A. The occasion of seeing God is often a crisis. **“King Uzziah died.”**
  - B. Notice the details of Isaiah's vision. **“I saw the Lord...”**
  - C. His praise comes from heavenly beings. **“Above him were seraphs, ...”**
  - D. Their confession is the holiness of God.
- II. The Reaction of Man Reveals Our Need. Isaiah 6:5-7 “Woe is me,’ I cried.”**
- A. There is a universal reaction to the presence of God. **“Woe is me!”**
  - B. Isaiah’s response to the holiness of God is an awareness of personal sin.
  - C. True worship will clarify our position before God.
- III. Isaiah Saw God’s Provision. Isaiah 6:6-8 “Whom shall I send?”**
- A. You will never be the same after such an experience with God.
  - B. True worship draws us into service.
    1. **“Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?” And I said, “Here am I. Send me!”**
