1. What is the best advice one could give to another person?
 2. One of the biggest temptations facing people today is the political correctness to relativism and pluralism.
 3. So what has emerged is a society with three basic relativistic notions.
 - a. Notion 1: Do what the crowd does.
 - b. Notion 2: Do what feels good.
 - c. Notion 3: Do what you want to do, and do it now.
 4. The best advice is this: “Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.” Proverbs 3:5-6
- I. First: Trust in God! Proverbs 3:5, “Trust in the Lord with all your heart.”
- A. You know what “with all your heart” means.
 1. “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment.” Matthew 22:37-38
 2. “That if you confess with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified.” Romans 10:9-10
 - B. Have you every had anyone in this life in whom you could trust?
- II. Second: Rely on God! Proverbs 3:6, “...and lean not on your own understanding.”
- A. Are you aware that everyone leans on something?
 - B. There's one warning that needs to go along with this.
- III. Third: Walk with God! Proverbs 3:6, “In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.”
- A. Acknowledge Him in all your ways.
 1. “Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus.” Philippians 2:5
 - B. There is the promise that follows. “...And he will make your paths straight.”
